The effect of Fukushima Nuclear Power Plant accident by Tsunami disaster is widely reported. We consider the World Health Organization (WHO) as the reliable source of objective information, and you may refer to their site to receive information of your interest.

"Risk is confirmed for those living within 30km of the Fukushima nuclear plant, however, radiation levels measured to date in other areas are below or equivalent level of background radiation that most people are exposed to in every day circumstances and will not cause immediate risk."

For your information, Tokyo is about 220km away from the Fukushima Nuclear plant and your destination, Yokohama is approximately 250km away.

Radiation levels are being monitored regularly so that you may obtain the updated information anytime you wish.
